Workshop Overview

Contrary to this is the story of sustainability; how our collective work sustains us, nourishes our hope, invites us to honour the resistance and strength we witness in the people we work alongside, and allows us to work congruently with our ethics. This experiential workshop will address our collective ethics and practices of Collective Care as opposed to self-care. Workers will be invited to begin to build their own "Solidarity Team"; examining who stands alongside them, what ideas and practices sustain them, and how they might access support when burnout attacks.
